


DEBUNKING 5 MYTHS ABOUT SNAKES¹



Snakes have crystals on their head.

This is a myth. Snakes have bones on their crown hood; but not carbonated crystals –that glow in the dark.

Snakes can be shape-shifters.

This is a myth. Snakes cannot shift shapes and become human beings.

If you kill a snake, one of the snake's relatives will come to take revenge.



This is a myth. Snakes do not have emotions like human beings. They are fearful of human beings. They bite to protect themselves.



Snakes drink milk.

Snakes do not drink milk. They are all carnivores and they must eat meat to survive. It is observed that they feel the milk pot by the long tongue, which creates an illusion of drinking milk.

Snakes have ears as such; they can hear the snake charmer.

Snakes do not have ears. Snakes have the tympanic membrane (which receives the vibrations from the ground), in place of ears. The hand movement of the snake charmer is observed by snakes in response.
