

The Faculty of Earth and Environmental Sciences at Dhaka University held a day-long Research Fair and Career Festival on 25 January 2026. Inaugurated by Vice Chancellor Professor Dr. Niyaz Ahmad Khan, the event showcased faculty and student research through poster presentations and connected students with career opportunities via exhibitions, collaboration forums, and networking sessions.



Among the featured posters was one highlighting the activities of the Avoidable Deaths Network (ADN) Bangladesh Chapter, including the celebration of the International Awareness Day for Avoidable Deaths (IAD4AD), recent flood relief efforts, and future needs such as establishing case study stations. It also outlined opportunities for students and researchers to join the network, contribute to ongoing projects, and participate in community engagement.

Faculty members expressed strong appreciation for the ADN Bangladesh Chapter, led by Dr. Fatima Akter, recognising it as a timely and vital initiative in addressing climate change and disaster risks. Students were inspired by ADN's commitment and showed keen interest in becoming active members, contributing to research, awareness campaigns, and community-based projects aimed at reducing avoidable deaths and enhancing preparedness. Many also expressed

enthusiasm for joining global campaigns and gaining field experience.

Flood Relief - 2024






Severe flooding in August 2024 affected several low-lying districts of Bangladesh, including Feni. Rapid needs assessments were conducted, and relief funds were raised internationally by ADN members.

The response was led by Dr. Fatima Akter, with support from teachers, students, and ADN Future Leader interns.
